

WORDLE GUIDELINES

- Before you leave today, you must submit a plan of work for your Wordle presentation.
- Your plan will list each of the group members and their job for the presentation.
 - Decide who is the Project Manager
 - *NOT the boss. This person helps keep everyone on task.*
 - Presenters
 - *Presenters must be knowledgeable and be able to define the terms; they may use a script if they like.*
 - Wordle Artist
 - *This person needs to be able to print the Wordle at home. I will not print your presentation materials for you.*
 - List the other jobs of your group members and tell me what that person will be doing. Be specific!
- Finish the hour by having every person in your group read the section you are assigned and make a list of important topics you think should be presented.
 - Everyone should be contributing to defining terms, people, and events.
- You have the rest of the hour today to work on this.
- Presentations will be tomorrow (3/31/16).
- Your presentation must be a minimum of five minutes long.
 - *If you go over 5 minutes, I will cut you off, regardless if you are finished presenting or not. THIS MAY AFFECT YOUR GRADE!*
- You will only have 15 minutes tomorrow at the beginning to practice.

How to Use Wordle

1. Start at the website <http://www.wordle.net/create> and click on the “create” tab at the top.
2. To create a wordle, simply type the words you want to appear in the box “Paste in a bunch of text.” Every new word should appear on a new line. For example, the terms, people, dates, etc. typed into the “Paste in a bunch of text:” should look like this:

3. The next screen is where you can manipulate the text to change the wordle you've created. I like to use the randomize button to move the text around; this option also changes the font. You can also use the “Edit”, “Font”, “Layout”, and “Color” tabs to change the look of your wordle.

Helpful Wordle Tips

Can I keep some words together?

To keep multiple words together on the same line, put a tilde (~) between the words. The tilde will be converted to a space when drawing the words, and the words will be treated as a single word.

- Example: in order for it to appear as World War II you would have to type it as World~War~II

How do I make one word bigger than another?

The size of a word in the visualization is proportional to the number of times the word appears in the input text.

- Example: If you type

communist
war
war
Germany
Germany
Germany

into the create page's text field, you'll see that war's font size is twice communist's, and Germany's font size is 3/2 that of war's.

**IMPORTANT NOTES TO THE WORDLE ARTIST ABOUT TEXT SIZE

1. The main topic of your Wordle presentation should be the biggest word(s) on the page; your main topic is not "Chapter 11, Section 1".
2. If you want your Wordle to be in color, it will need to be printed at home, as the classroom computer can only print in black and white.

WORDLE RUBRIC

	Above Basic (points x 2)	Basic (points x 1.75)	Below Basic (points x 1.5)
Teamwork (5 points)	The team worked well together to achieve requirements. Each member contributed in a valuable manner.	The team worked well together most of the time, with only a few occurrences of communication breakdown or failure to collaborate. Members were mostly respectful to each other.	Team did not collaborate or communicate well. Some members worked independently. A lack of respect and regard was frequently noted.
Coherence & Subject Knowledge (20 points)	All requirements are identified. The presentation was easy to follow and error free.	Some requirements are not identified. Not all of the information was supported/easily defined.	Many requirements are not identified. Information presented was incorrect.
Content & Creativity (20 points)	The presentation contained an abundance of material which was clearly related to the focus question.	The presentation contained material related to the focus question, but not all material clearly related to the focus question.	The audience had to made considerable effort to understand how the material presented was related to the focus question. Chapter Terms specific to the section were missing.

2. The Wordle presentation answers the section focus question.
3. The Wordle presentation is a minimum of five minutes long.
4. The presentation materials are complete and printed upon entry to class on 3/31/16.
